Impact Analysis: from 2023 Annual Stewardship Report

Across 160 communities in El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Mexico, 339 trained volunteers tended to the health and wellbeing of 4,827 children and 1,245 pregnant women, conducting 55,680 home visits.

Over 32,000 nutritious meals were served to vulnerable families and children. These meals were organized and prepared by our volunteers and often served in their homes.

In Honduras, 310 high-quality water filters were distributed for use among 1,240 families suffering extreme potable-water insecurity. Each family received training on how to use and properly maintain the filters.

In Guatemala, 120 new community-serving chicken coops were established, providing a sustainable source of food, encouraging collaboration, and helping disrupt the cycle of dependency.

Volunteers distributed 652,800 packets of child nutritional supplements, 14,400 bags of rice and soy, and 336,000 units of maternal vitamins for expectant mothers, totaling 1M+ supplements.

In Honduras, 11 pilot tilapia micro-fisheries were

established in 5 communities.

100% of children ages 0 to 6 months were fed exclusively with their mothers' breastmilk. This amazing achievement was to a large degree the result of the counseling efforts of Hope for a Healthier Humanity volunteers.

Volunteers ensured that 100% of program beneficiary children received their necessary vaccinations, and we assisted local clinics with donations of medicines, equipment, and supplies.

Essential antibiotics, vitamins, and other medicines valued at \$3,677,001 were shipped to El Salvador and Honduras.
